The 2024 Utah Legislature passed Senate Bill 270, "Utah Lake and Great Salt Lake Study Amendments," which tasks the Utah Division of Forestry, Fire and State Lands (FFSL) with conducting a study to determine how to enhance Utah Lake. The bill specifies enhancing the following benefits associated with Utah Lake in a manner consistent with the division's management authority over sovereign lands under Section 65A-10-1:

- 1 Improving the clarity and quality of the water
- Conserving water resources in and around the lake
- Removing invasive plant and animal species (including phragmites and carp)
- Restoring and improving the shallow waters (littoral zone) and other plant communities
- Restoring and conserving native fish and other aquatic species (including Bonneville cutthroat trout and June Sucker)
- 6 Increasing the suitability of Utah Lake and its surrounding areas for shorebirds, waterfowl, and other avian species
- Maximizing, enhancing, and ensuring recreational access and opportunities
- 8 Improving the use of UL for residents and visitors
- 9 Substantially accommodating an existing use on land in or around Utah Lake
- Providing any other benefits identified by FFS

The Utah Lake Study will include: a review of existing information; public and stakeholder outreach, engagement, and coordination (including with the State Engineer); and the development of an implementation plan. The study team will be coordinating with other planning efforts and agencies throughout the study process.

A **Planning Team** of resource managers and scientists with expertise in the various benefits defined by the bill will serve as technical working group for the study.

A **Steering Committee** of state agency leaders will provide executive input on the processes and outcomes of the study to ensure that strategies are legally sound and scientifically defensible.
